Recent Events

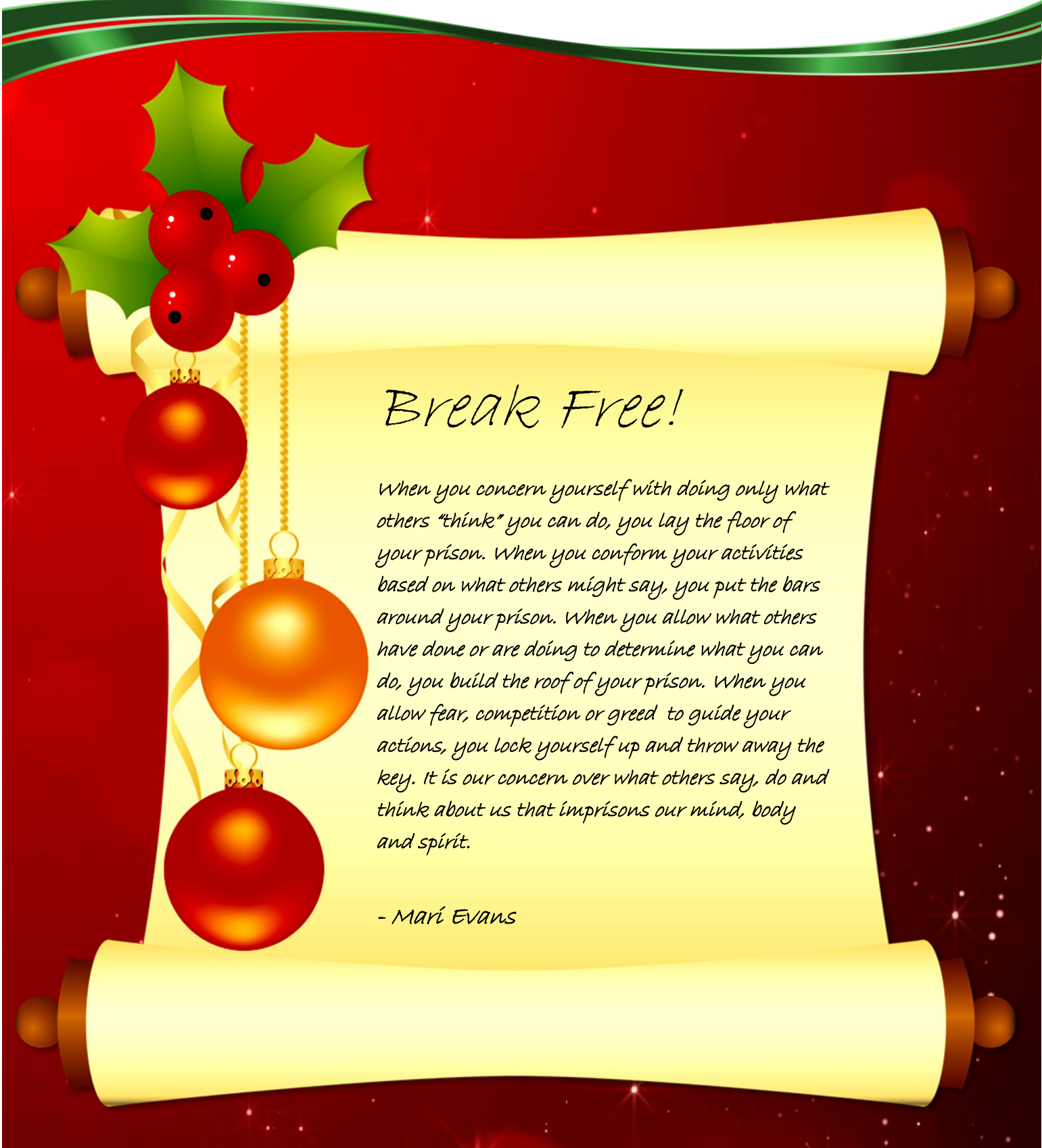
The Tobago Chapter organized two successful seminars – the BIR and NIS. Welcome aboard Tobago and congratulations.
